- The Wilbrahams and Six Mile Bottom Mondays and Thursdays.

• Appointment Times:

Pre-bookable appointments must be between 9:10 & 9:40.

HOW:

To take advantage of the service, simply contact the reception team here at the surgery and tell them that you'd like to make an appointment with transport. (Remembering the appointments available are between 9:10 & 9:40).

The reception team will then offer you appointments that are available and organise your transport.

The reception team contact the drivers 2 days prior to your appointment to give them the details of who needs picking up and where from.

Patients are asked to be ready to leave their house in good time as there may be other patients to collect along the way.

The drivers will wait for you whilst you're at the surgery and will take you home after your appointment.

We would really like to promote how helpful and invaluable this service is and has been to many of our patients and we encourage patients who have never used this service to feel free to enquire and take advantage of this very useful scheme.
